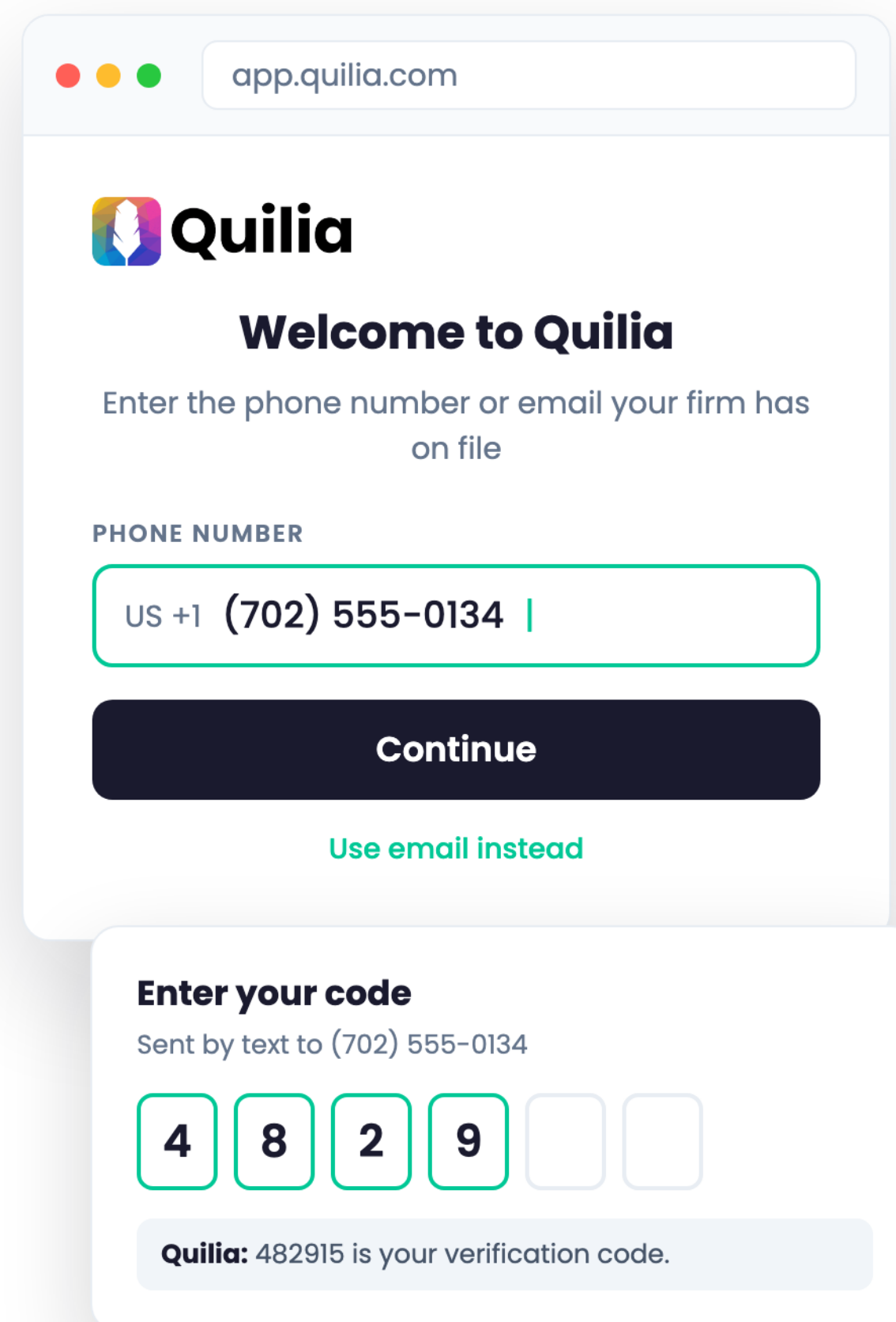


Signing in on the web

You do not need the app to use Quilia. You can sign in from any web browser with the same account, on a computer, tablet, or phone. It takes about a minute.

Sign in at app.quilia.com

- 1 Go to **app.quilia.com** in your browser. Chrome, Safari, Edge, and Firefox all work.
- 2 Enter your **phone number or email**. Use the same one you gave your firm, then agree to the terms.
- 3 Check your **texts or your inbox**. We send you a 6-digit code right after — by text if you entered your number, by email if you entered your email. Nothing pops up on the screen.
- 4 Type that code into the website to confirm it is you. There is no password to remember.
- 5 **You are connected.** Message your legal team, upload documents and photos, and keep them updated on your treatment and appointments.

Give it about thirty seconds, then use Resend code. Make sure the number or email you typed is the same one your firm has on file. For texts, check that short codes are not being blocked; for email, check your spam folder. Still stuck? Message your legal team and they can sort it out.
